The Mini Mix - 'It's Good To Talk' - Collective Worship

During this half terms assemblies I've been asking the young people who they would talk to if they were worried about something. Teasing out the importance of talking to a trusted adult, like their teachers or teaching assistants, and reminding them that keeping worries or concerns to themself isn't healthy. We've then been thinking about who else they can talk to about absolutely anything; somebody who is always ready to listen, any time, any place, any where. Needless to say they always come up with the correct answer.

I've then asked them if they know how to talk to Father God and what we call it when we do; asking for a show of hands of those who think they know how to pray, and those who aren't sure. This is where Larry the Lettuce and his sandwich comes in (on the front cover). We've then had a great discussion sharing our favourite sandwiches! And if you know how to make a sandwich then you know how to pray!

I've then used the illustration of a 'Prayer Sandwich' to help the young people understand that prayer doesn't have to follow 'rules' but how using a simple structure can make prayer easier, until it's just like a conversation with a special friend. Encouraging the young people to talk to Father God and reminding them that God always listens to our prayers and will always respond, but not necessarily in the way we expect! We don't always get what we want, but Father God always knows what we need. Songs have included 'Jesus Really Loves Me' & It's Me O Lord'
